



Manvel Public Works Campus

The Public Works Campus will have two wings— an Administrative Building, 7,500 ft², to house administrative staff and department leadership, and a Maintenance Shop, 12,700 ft², to accommodate the department’s fleet of service vehicles, storage, and workspace for public works operations.





Elevated Storage Tank

The Elevated Storage Tank (EST), commonly known as a water tower, is an important investment in Manvel's water infrastructure. Once completed, the EST will store 1,000,000 gallons of water and assist in regulating the municipal water supply by maintaining consistent pressure throughout the system, even during peak usage hours.







Masters Road Utility Improvements and McCoy Road Lift Station Consolidation

This project will extend water and sanitary sewer services north along Masters Rd. The project was combined with the Lewis sanitary trunk and McCoy lift station abatement. By expanding these utilities, the City aims to support future growth and development in the area while improving service reliability for existing customers.




Vehicle Stops & Calls for Service






