






# Capital Projects

The Central Water Reclamation Facility is another major addition to Manvel's utility infrastructure. The facility will treat and recycle wastewater for reuse. By reclaiming and repurposing water, the facility will help conserve freshwater resources, making Manvel's water supply more sustainable.




# Capital Projects

## Manvel Public Works Campus

The Public Works Campus will have two wings— an Administrative Building, 7,500 ft<sup>2</sup>, to house administrative staff and department leadership, and a Maintenance Shop, 12,700 ft<sup>2</sup>, to accommodate the department’s fleet of service vehicles, storage, and workspace for public works operations.



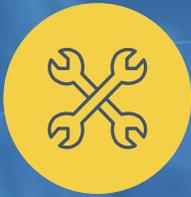
